

TUITION & AFFORDABILITY

The Derryfield School commits to ensuring access to an independent school education by bridging the gap between family resources and educational expenses through our need-based Equitable Tuition program. We provide over **\$4.5 million** annually in need-based assistance to students.

Recognizing those who contribute a variety of talents to The Derryfield School, merit scholarships (need-based and non-need based) are awarded to 12% of students.

Amoskeag Scholars

This program supports bright and motivated applicants from historically underserved communities with a tuition-free merit scholarship.

Students applying to entry in grades 7-12 who qualify for need-based equitable tuition are eligible. Priority is granted to students admitted from the Breakthrough Manchester program. Up to two scholars are named each year.

Malone Scholars

A generous grant to financial aid endowment from The Malone Foundation allows Derryfield to enroll gifted students who lack the financial resources to best develop their talents. The Derryfield School is the only school in NH to receive this grant.

Students applying to entry in grades 7-12 who are in the top 5% of their class, or who have scored at or above the 95th percentile on a recognized standard achievement test, are eligible. Families of applying students must qualify for funding of at least 30% of tuition and be US citizens.

Carlson Scholars

The Peter Carlson '83 Financial Aid Fund creates a permanently endowed scholarship fund that honors Pete's dedication to educational equity.

Students applying to entry in grades 6-12 who qualify for need-based equitable tuition are eligible. Preference is granted to students from public school districts in Manchester, NH and environs.

Core Values Scholars

This program seeks to recognize bright, motivated students each year who demonstrate qualities that will add meaning and vitality to Derryfield's core values. Grants are awarded in the amount of \$16,000 per year and last for the duration of a student's enrollment.

Students applying to entry in grades 6-12 who complete the Core Values Merit Application are eligible. Up to two scholars are named each year.

Founders Scholars

This program recognizes students who exhibit qualities that the founding members of The Derryfield School envisioned. Grants range from \$2,000 - \$10,000, and vary in duration.

New and returning students are eligible at the discretion of the Merit Committee.
